

This week has been super odd with testing and half of the students participating in that. We have adjusted well and it was a great time to focus on skills with just one grade! I am super proud of all the 3rd graders that participated in testing this week! It was so rewarding to see how smart they all are.

We focused our week on multiplication, division, and 4-to-5-digit addition and subtracting. This was a great review week for all the second graders and we got to practice our skills. We will continue doing these 4 things until the end of the year.

The reading strategy we used this week was character traits and identifying point of view. We read a book and then each student created their own character to fit the story. It was fun to see how the story shifted and adapted when students created a character



with positive or negative character traits. We spent time with possessive pronouns and longer words with long vowels. As always, we had a focus on our vocabulary words and the series of things that we do each week with them (complex sentences, task card, semantic mapping, etc.).


Lastly, we spent time on weather and climate with a focus on weather hazards and how to keep helping our earth. On Earth Day, we spent time cleaning up trash around the school. We also built weather vanes to monitor the wind. This required some trial and error but was exciting nonetheless. We are ending the week with reviewing sunlight.

4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Elementary Teacher



The main event this week for the fourth and fifth graders was MCA testing. The students tested in reading and math. Only the fifth graders tested for science. These tests measure how well students know the MN State Standards in reading, math and science. The students seemed to try their very best each day, and felt proud of their hard work. Families will receive results of the testing sometime in the fall. MAP testing is coming up on May 8th and 10th. These tests measure academic growth from this school year, fall to spring. Families will receive the results of MAP tests at the end of the school year.

We also had time this week for some of our regular academic subjects. In math and science, we are studying measurement in both the customary and metric systems. Students often wonder

why we need to learn the metric system here in the U.S., and the answer to that is science! In science, the metric system is almost always used. It also helps to know a bit about the metric system if traveling to other countries. We have started with measurement of length, and will move on to capacity and weight in the next couple of weeks.

It seems that spring has arrived, and around here we all know that can mean mud! We go outside daily, so be sure that your child has outerwear that can repel rain, and boots that can go in the mud.
