






Birch Buddies ~ HIKE! special after school program "spring session" coming soon.

It was another busy week in K/1! In language arts, we discussed character traits. We identified the actions and what the characters say to identify traits about that character. In math, we learned about shapes. We can identify 2d and 3d shapes, and acute, obtuse, and right angles found in shapes.

It sounded like everyone had a great spring break! I am excited to get back into it for the last portion of the school year. We have spent the week re-establishing classroom expectations and routines while progressing through new material. We will continue to work on this as students get excited for the warmer weather.

We have switched gears in math and started prepping for testing and for the next grade. Third graders started with review of third grade material that is essential for the beginning of fourth grade while reviewing important words that they may see in the standardized tests coming up. This was mostly place value and rounding with numbers up to a million. Second grade started with a base understanding of multiplication and strategies to solve multiplication facts. They were so thrilled to have fresh material to learn. These are all things that will help them as they move onto third grade.

In language arts, we focused vocabulary words and text structure this week. This was paired with developing complex sentences for their vocab words and completing graphic organizers during reading groups. We also touched on possessive nouns and what that means in a sentence. Each student has grown so much in reading and their confidence. This has shown in our reading activities.

Our research project continues but is winding down. The goal for this week is to finish slide shows and their timeline. Next week we will apply our finishing touches and schedule dates to present to the class. This has been a long learning process for everyone but it has turned out so amazing.

Ensure that students are still coming with winter gear. We had many students without hats, mittens, and snowpants this week and we try to get outside whenever possible.

4th & 5th Grade Elementary Teacher

The fourth and fifth graders came back from spring break focused and ready to learn! This week we are finishing up the last parts of our language arts and math curriculums, and will soon be ready to review concepts for the MCA and MAP testing that is coming up.

We also finished up a writing unit on poetry this week. Many of the students surprised themselves

on how much they enjoy reading and writing poetry! Our next writing projects will focus on informative writing, with our first project being about sea turtles. Students will do research on sea turtles before writing informational guidebooks on the subject.

In social studies, our focus this week was geography of the U.S. We have been practicing our map reading skills, and also graphing skills.

In science, students studied superposition, which is the concept that the oldest layers of sediment on earth are on the bottom, and the youngest are on the top. This becomes complicated as the sediment layers get moved around by different geological forces. Students demonstrated how the layers can move with modeling clay. The clay was also used later in the week for creating sculptures in art.
